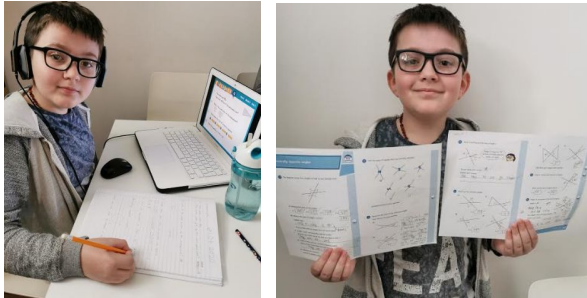


White Rose Maths Party!
