

Year R Home Challenges 1/4/2020

Here are a few ideas to complete at home. Please share on tapestry and I will give you some more personalised learning ideas for your child. If your child is finding these too easy or hard please ask for support and challenge ideas. I have included links to youtube and twinkl.



This week's number is 13. Count up to 13 and back to zero. Write the numbers, find 13 objects. Start in one spot take 13 steps where did you stop?

- Make some number cards from 1 to 13. Draw the correct number of spots and the numerals on them. Place them face down – turn 1 over and say the number that is 1 more and 1 less. Use your fingers if you need to. Challenge: numbers to 20.

- Draw a circle, square, triangle and oblong. Look around the house can you find the shapes. Draw some of the shapes you find.

- Design a fit trail around the garden/house. Try and include skipping, jumping and hopping.
- Practise catching – use an everyday object such as a jumper – they don't roll away! As you get better use smaller objects and then try with a ball.



Show your child how to use google to find out about the artist Kandinsky. Look at some of his pictures and talk about the shapes you can see. Which pictures do they like best and why?

Choose some objects from around the house to draw around to make a picture like Kandinsky's.



- Practise saying the sounds on your sound mat. Read a new digraph each day.
- Ask a grown up to say the sounds – you write them. Practise any you find tricky.
- Read and write words from your tricky word mat – can you write them in a sentence?
- Read a book on Bug Club. Draw a picture of your favourite part. Write (or copy) a sentence to go with your picture.
