

## Year R Home Challenges 29/4/2020

This week's number is 16. Count up to 16 and back to zero. Write the numbers, find 16 objects. Count out 16 blocks. Cut out 16 squares by folding paper. What shapes can you make with 16? Make sure your child is counting carefully. If they are not – reduce the number of objects your child is counting. Watch numberblocks <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iuzRI6CXdlg>

1. Make a number 16 card to go with the other numbers you made. Draw the correct number of spots and the numerals on them. Get someone to hide the numbers. Can you find them in the correct order?
2. Watch the numberblocks pattern episode. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bT7282PUKnY> Can you make a new bridge for the numberblocks to cross – it could be across a path in the garden or to get from the sofa to the chair – be careful of the carpet crocodiles!
3. Can you make an animal movement pattern? Use the movement sheet from last week's home learning. Try making a pattern with 3 animals. How could you record the pattern?

Which is your favourite animal movement? How many can you do in 30 seconds? Write down how many you do and try to improve your score.

In science we will be learning about how plants grow. Look at the plants you have. Can you find a stem, leaf, flower or petal?

Can you dig up some weeds and find the roots. Use playdough or junk to make a flower with all the different parts.



1. Practise saying the sounds on your sound mat. Read a new digraph each day. Watch alphablocks: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ppb9We6g8BA> Practise writing ai. Read and write the ai words.
2. Watch this Jasper and the Beanstalk story. [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Da6lxY\\_8jmUI](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Da6lxY_8jmUI) After each page, ask your child what will happen next. Write the days of the week down one side of a page. Get your child to draw what happened on each day. Write a sentence about what Jasper did.
3. Choose 3 new tricky words to practise writing.
4. Practise writing ladder letters in your book. Write a line of each letter. (see last week's home learning)
5. Read at least 2 books on Bug Club this week.
