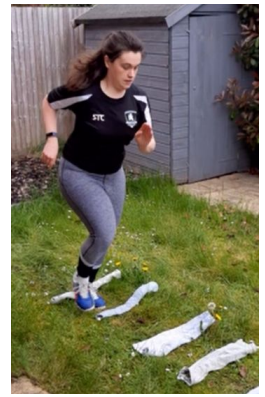




Hello Year 2 - I hope you've all had a lovely week.
