

The teachers have been playing TTRS as well and they're getting pretty good, so I hope you're


Beni has had a go at the Maths challenges each week. He had a go at countdown and reached the target number! Great work

## Strike it Out



Try this game: draw a number line from 1 to 20. The first player picks two numbers, crosses them out and circles either their sum or their difference. The second player crosses out the circled number and another number that's still left, and again circle the sum or the difference.

The winner is the person who stops their opponent from being able to move!

The sum is the answer you get by adding the two numbers together and the difference is the answer you get when you take the smaller number away from the larger number.



It's not a challenge this week but a game you can play with any member of your family as many times as you want! Can you beat your siblings? Can you beat your parents?
