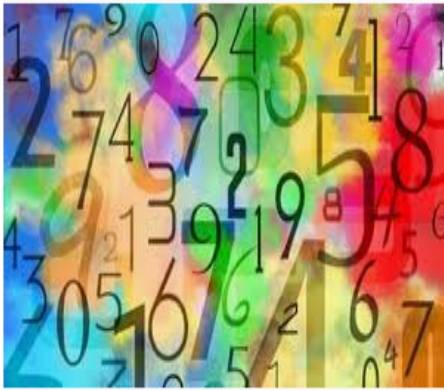


## Year R Home Challenges 3/6/2020

This week's number is 19. Count up to 19 and back to zero. Write the numbers, find 19 objects. Count out 19 blocks. Share them with teddy. How many can you have each? Can you put it on the part, part, whole diagram (see separate sheet) Make sure your child is counting carefully. If they are not – reduce the number of objects your child is counting. Watch numberblocks <https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/m0006xcw/numberblocks-series-4-the-lair-of-shares> (The Lair of share ) Make a number 19 card to go with the other numbers you made. Draw the correct number of spots and the numerals on them. Get someone to hide the numbers. Can you find them in the correct order?

2. Get some orange segments (or some other fruit) to share them with an adult. Can you share them so one person has more and one has less. How many do you have each? Can you share them into equal groups so that you have the same?



Jumping – how many different ways can you jump? 1 leg/2 legs/ hands and feet? Can you jump over a toy? How far can you jump? Can you jump over

Choose a room or the garden. Tell an adult where things are using words like next to, beside, in front of. Can you draw a picture of what you see with all the things in the right place?

If you could re-design the room/garden what would you put in there? Draw a new picture.

What do you know about bees? Use the internet to find out more. Can you make a bee from playdough. Make sure you count the legs carefully!

4. Practise writing ladder letters in your book. Write a line of each letter.
5. Read at least 2 books on Bug Club this week.
