Magic Vs



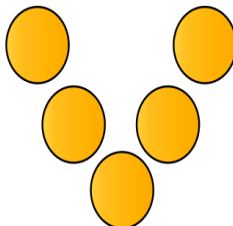
Place each of the numbers 1 to 5 in the V shape so that the two arms of the V have the same total.
