Design a theme park!!

Now that you have researched lots of theme parks around the world, it is your time to design a theme park, however, there are some instructions to follow.

You have been given £5 million pounds (£5,000,000) to build your theme park. You cannot spend a penny over.

It is your choice as to what type of rides you have, but you must have food places, toilets, bins, picnic benches and a first aid room. More details about this can be found on the next page.

The cost and spacing of the different types of rides can be found on the next page.

Each square on your map represent 50cm².

There is a square map for you to design your theme park on and a budget sheet to help you with your costs.

Top tips - Think about the theme parks you have researched and use ideas from them. Are you going to have different sections in your theme park with different rides in? For example, a children's section and then a water ride section.
