As I'm sure you have seen, I pretended to be a film director at the weekend and made and edited a video for everyone in year 2. It was a lot of fun

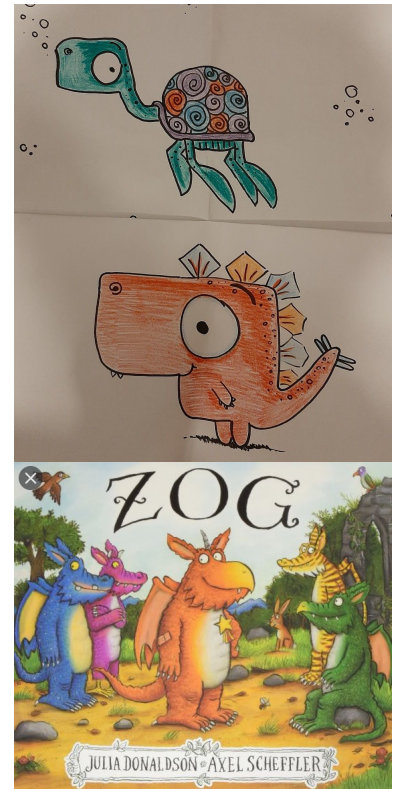
